This is a rest camp where we stay for a day or two to rest up before going farther we hiked out bout three miles from the port to this camp over good hard rock roads and the pack certainly gets heavy. A man just came in and appointed me for 2 hrs guard duty - Oh you war - There are some German Prisoners here to do some of the work - The country is certainly pretty grass still green & long and houses all stone with queer people and queer customs - but war is war - and we've got to take it - I don't know anything bout the weather but it looks very much like rain now and they say there isn't much sunshine at this time of the year - I'm getting used to
